☐ The winning essay will be awarded a £250 prize ☐ The winning essay will be posted on the Society's website which can be used as research by people all over the world ☐ All entries of merit will receive a certificate of achievement and expert feedback from the Society's panel of assessors, to help you improve your skills ☐ You could include your participation in your personal statements for University applications. This could be valuable with University Admissions staff looking out for additional evidence beyond examination grades of a student's enterprise and achievement ☐ Researching and writing your essay will help you develop skills of value to you in your future academic career ☐ We hope you will develop a life-long interest in the area in which you live



What we want from you

☐ You need to register with the Society an interest, including proposing a subject that you'd like to research and write about ☐ Your topic should deal with an aspect of the history or natural history of South-West Scotland ☐ The winning essays in the last two years have dealt with: (a) the story behind a death mask on display in Dumfries Museum (b) the story behind a ruined cottage in the village where the student lives ☐ Other entries have looked at such varied topics as a cholera outbreak in Nineteenth-Century Dumfries and the problems of beekeeping in South-West Scotland ☐ You might find it possible to write an essay that in some way relates to your project work for Higher Examinations, eg a local study growing out of a broader historical / natural history project ☐ You will need to submit an original essay based on your own research (1,500-2,500 words) by the end of October 2025. We hope that this timetable will enable you to seek advice from a relevant teacher, carry out preliminary work during the summer holiday, write the essay during the autumn half term and discuss any loose ends with your teacher before submitting the essay.
